Important Rules to remember

We will be most appreciative if you could keep the following things in mind



- Payment for your stay takes place on your check-in day. If you arrived outside of our office hours, please stop by the reception the next day to finalize your check-in. **Our reception is across the street at 45 rue de l'Arbre Sec**, open Monday-Saturday 10AM-6PM. If we don't hear from you, we will charge the balance to the credit card on file by default.



- **It is strictly forbidden to smoke in the apartment** or anywhere inside our premises. **Smoking is subject to an extra fee of 150 € per day.**



- Please notify us of any damages to the apartment perceived or occurred during your stay, so we can take appropriate measures together. If property is found damaged after check-out, **we reserve the right to charge up to 300 € for compensation.**



- **We ask you to leave the apartment with the dishes cleaned or in the dishwasher and to gather the trash.** If the apartment is left excessively dirty, an extra cleaning fee of 60-150 € will be charged. If you need to take the trash out during your stay you can leave it in the hallway outside your door, our staff will pick it up.



- The apartment comes clean with fresh sheets and towels. Housekeeping is available at an extra cost of 30 € a day or 50 € with clean sheets.



- **Check-out time is scheduled for 10 am** on your departure day. You have the option to securely leave your luggage at our reception across the street at 45 rue de l'Arbre Sec on the day of your check-out during opening hours or in the luggage lockers located on the ground floor.



- **Quiet hours are from 10 pm to 8 am.** In order to respect the tranquility of your neighbors, please avoid excessive noise in the premises during those hours.



- **Don't forget your key card that activates the lights when you exit the apartment.**



- **Close the windows before leaving.** This is for your safety and to avoid a water invasion in case it rains while you're out. **The heat/AC will automatically shut off when you open windows.**



- **Do not overload the lift.** It can only fit 3 people at once. Please do not let young children use it unsupervised and do not transport anything (suitcases, etc.) without adult supervision.



- Our reception is open Monday-Saturday, 10 am-6 pm, just across the street at 45 rue de l'Arbre Sec. **You can reach the reception by phone by using the phone in your apartment and dialing 00.** Please call our cell phone at + 33 6 11 20 18 77 in case you need assistance after hours.



Check-out Instructions

- ❖ **Check-out is 10 am on your departure date.**
- ❖ You can **store your luggage** for the day at our reception across the street at 45 rue de l'Arbre Sec, Monday – Saturday, from 10 am to 6 pm or in the luggage lockers located on the ground floor of the building.
- ❖ If you check-out on a Sunday and **need luggage storage**, please use the lockers located on the ground floor.
- ❖ Your check-out cleaning is included in the rental price. However, if we find the apartment excessively dirty, we will have to charge you an extra 60-150 € cleaning fee, depending on the extra time needed to clean. Thank you for your comprehension.
- ❖ Please leave the cards/keys on the kitchen table and close the door or drop them off at the reception.

Security deposit

Apartments du Louvre reserves the right to charge a guest up to 300 € in case any damage made to the apartment has occurred during the stay. We cancel your security deposit within 48 hours of your check-out date. As our guest, you are responsible for maintaining the apartment in good conditions. We ask you to let us know before you leave if you caused any damages so that we can take the appropriate measures. If we estimate that the apartment incurred damages or that an extra cleaning is needed, we will communicate that to you in full transparency.



Your Apartment

Welcome to your apartment. Each of our apartments is unique and equipped with everything needed to make your stay easy and comfortable.



Sofa Bed

If there is a sofa bed in your apartment. Simply grab the back rest and pull it gently towards you. Make sure there isn't any clutter (coffee table, luggage) in front of the couch as you pull it out. The pillows are either inside the back rest or in the closet along with the duvet cover.



Washing Machine

The washing machine is there for your use. A few detergent tabs are also available underneath the kitchen sink. The soap goes in the box you must pull out located on the top left side of the machine. Once you close the door and start the program, you'll have to wait until the cycle fully ends to open it. To do a dry only cycle choose "sechage" and also press the "sechage" button.

We ask you treat it with care; please do not force the door open, do not overload the machine, and don't put in too much soap, the machine doesn't like it. Thank you!



TV

The TV offers various channels in different languages. They all begin starting channel 46. Channels 1-45 are in french.

Heating and Air Conditioning

Central heat and air conditioning is available for your comfort. You'll find the thermostat on the wall. **Please note that the heat or AC will shut off if you open the windows in order to preserve energy.**



Electricity Use

All of your apartments' energy comes from electricity (hot water, heat, stove...), which can sometimes cause strain to our circuit breakers if too many appliances are on at once (especially hair dryers and straighteners). If you lose power, please have a look at the circuit breaker located by the entrance, and check the individual fuses to make sure they are all on 'on' mode turned (up). If not, switch the one(s) that are off. If the power loss is apartment wide, then check the main breaker, the smaller box with a black and red button. Push the black button all the way in to turn the power back on. If none of these solutions work, call us for assistance.



Safe

We have an easy-to-use safe box for your valuables located in the closet. To close it, dial a 4-6 digit code of your choosing and press L to lock. To unlock, just dial that same code again.



Hot Water

Please be mindful of how long you leave the hot water continuously running. Since the building provides hot water through electric boiler heaters if the hot water is left running continuously for an extended amount of time it may run out and then you'll have to wait a bit for it to warm up again.



Trash room and Recycling

If you have rubbish to dispose of, please feel free to leave your full garbage bags outside your door in the hallway, our cleaning staff will pick it up and dispose of it appropriately. Or you can bring it downstairs on the ground floor in the garbage room located to the left of the elevator.

We recycle! Thank you for separating organic waste and glass from paper, plastic and cans. The green bin is for organic waste and the yellow top bin is for recycling. Please refrain from throwing your rubbish in bins or public trash cans on the street, we appreciate your care in this matter.



General Security and Safety Advice

At the Apartment

- ❖ Please do not smoke or use candles anywhere in the building. For your safety, open flames are strictly forbidden. Smoking is strictly forbidden anywhere in the building or apartments and is subject to a daily fine of 150€
- ❖ There are fire extinguishers on each floor by the lift and in the cupboard in the kitchen entrance or closet inside your apartment. Each apartment is equipped with a smoke detector; please warn us immediately if you notice yours is not working.
- ❖ Make sure the building front door is closed as you enter and leave. Do not let people in unless you know them.

In Paris

Our neighborhood (and Paris) is generally a very safe place to walk around day or night; but as with many European capitals, **there are pick pockets especially in busy tourist areas and particularly in public transportation**. Be aware and keep your belongings secured at all times. Be careful if strangers approach you asking you to sign or read papers they hand to you. They are usually there to distract you.

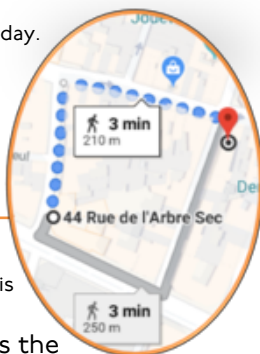

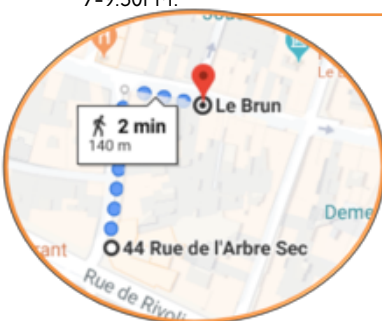

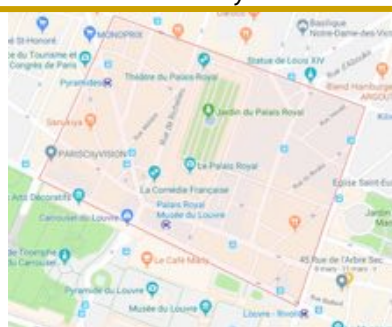
Just a few steps away from the Louvre Museum, nestled in a quiet one way street in a mixed residential and shopping district, our buildings are surrounded by great restaurants, parks and monuments. Take a tour of the surrounding blocks:

Vendôme

Named after one of the most famous and luxurious squares in Paris, the Vendôme district is now home for the most prestigious jewelry and fashion boutiques in the city, and the largest luxury hotels such as the Ritz and Vendôme. You can enjoy all the charm of its classical architecture during a walk along the rue Saint-Honoré before being carried away by the flavors of the macarons from Ladurée tea room and its woodwork and frescoes dated from the nineteenth century.



Palais-Royal



In the heart of the 1st district, the Palais-Royal district was formed for the first time during the French Revolution and is home to several tourist sites steeped in history. From the imposing building of La Comédie Française, to the “Buren columns” of the Palais-Royal and Place des Victoires. At Place des Pyramides you can contemplate Joan of Arc, bareheaded and wearing an armor. It is a vibrant neighborhood full of good gastronomic options and with a strong cultural heritage.

Saint-Germain-l'Auxerrois



Divided between the right bank of the Seine and the western portion of the Ile de la Cité, it was the first district of Paris. Its monumental buildings such as the Gothic church that lends its name to the district, the former royal residence which houses the Louvre museum or the remains of the old palace of the city (the Sainte-Chapelle and the Conciergerie), reveals to us the history of the French capital.

Just a few steps away from the Louvre Museum, nestled in a quiet one way street in a mixed residential and shopping district, our Saint-Honoré buildings are surrounded by great restaurants, parks and monuments. Take a tour of the surrounding blocks:

Île Saint-Louis



The island of Saint-Louis is, with the Ile de la Cité, one of the two natural islands of the Seine still remaining in Paris today. It takes its current name (since 1725) from King Louis IX, referred to as St. Louis. Remaining almost identical for nearly four centuries, its architecture and atmosphere of independent village transformed it into an ideal place for a stroll or picnic and to have an aperitif with your feet almost in the water.

Saint-Germain des Prés



Born from a small town around the abbey of Saint Germain-des-Près in the Middle Ages, this district experienced its golden age during the post-war, thanks to emblematic characters like Jean-Paul Sartre, Simone de Beauvoir, Picasso, Jean-Luc Godard, etc. There still remains places where artists and intellectuals gathered, such as breweries Le Procope and LIPP and cafes Flore and Les Deux Magots. Festive and cosmopolitan, the Saint-Germain district maintains this nostalgic atmosphere from the beautiful Parisian era.



Île de la Cité

Considered the ancient cradle of the city of Paris, before called Lutèce, the Ile de la Cité was transformed into an administrative center during the Haussmann Era. It currently serves as the headquarters of the Préfecture of Police, the Commercial Court and the Courthouse of the capital. It is also home to the beautiful Notre-Dame Cathedral, numerous small gardens and charming squares, such as the almost “hidden” Place Dauphine, the Place Louis-Lépine and its exotic Queen-Elizabeth II flower market.





Your Visit

Means of Transport

Trying to decide which is the best, fastest or cheapest option to move around Paris considering the number of days you are staying in the city? Here you have different kinds of tickets/pass and other ways of transport you can use during your visit.



Metro

Perhaps the fastest and cheapest public transportation of all. You have two main options of tickets:

1. **T+ Ticket:** this ticket allows you to travel on:



- Metro lines
- RER lines (RATP and SNCF) in Paris (zone I)
- Ile-de-France bus lines (RATP and OPTILE), except Orlybus and Roissybus
- Tramlines (RATP and SNCF)
- The Montmartre Funicular

With this kind of ticket you are able to do the following types of connections: metro/metro, metro/RER and RER/RER within Paris (Zone I), metro/bus, bus/bus (including between the RATP and OPTILE networks), bus/tram and tram/tram for 90 minutes between the first and last validation.

***Please note:** it is not possible to make bus/metro, metro/tram, RER/bus and RER/tram connections using the same t+ ticket. Also: the metro tickets degauss easily. Try not to leave them along with coins or magnetic cards.

Bus

A single journey costs 2 € if you buy your ticket directly on the bus. However, you will save money by using the **tickets t+** with a cost of 1.90 € or 14,90 € if you buy a pack of 10 tickets.

Navigo Découverte

Need a weekly package that makes your life easier? Discover how to travel simply with the Navigo Découverte card. The card navigo Découverte is a travel pass that grants full and unrestricted access to all public transport inside the Ile-de-France region. ***Please note:** the weekly rate is always valid from Monday to Sunday. Which means when the card is purchased on a Wednesday, for example, is only valid for 5 days, until the following Sunday.

Prices for all (adults and children): 5 € for the card and 22.80 € for a week's recharge, this card includes all areas of Paris 1-5 ("toutes zones", CDG airport and Eurodisney included). You can use it as many times as you want during the week.



Bike

Thinking of visiting the city on two wheels? Paris offers several options for renting bicycles, accessible from physical stations or from an application on your smartphone. Get to know the main ones:

Vélib'

Is the 'official' bike rental of Paris. You will find several stations used to grab and to drop off the bicycles all around the city. They also have electric bikes available to rent and the service does not require pre-registration.

Prices:

- 24 hours ticket: 5 € (plus 1 € each 30 minutes counting from the second half hour).
- 7 days ticket: 15 € (plus 1 € each 30 minutes counting from the second half hour).



Mobike

This is the largest shared bike service, which does not require physical stations to remove or drop off the bikes. When you find a Mobike on the streets, you must scan the QR-code on the bike to unblock it. Mobike requires a mobile application that can be registered for free on iStore or GooglePlay.

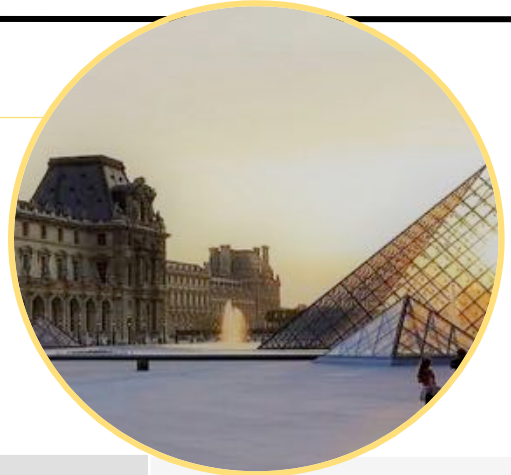

❖ Museums

The Louvre

The Louvre Museum, inaugurated in 1793 at the Palais du Louvre, former royal residence located in the center of Paris, is today the largest museum of art and antiques in the world, with an exhibition area of 72,735 m². Its original construction dates from 1190, but it was only in 1317 that the castle was transformed into a royal residence. Currently, the Louvre Museum receives more than 8 million visitors a year and holds over 550,000 pieces, including the famous Mona Lisa, from Leonardo da Vinci, and Alexandros of Antioch's Venus de Milo.



OPENING HOURS

- Monday, Thursday, Saturday, Sunday: from 9 am to 6 pm.
- Wednesday, Friday: from 9 am to 9:45 pm.
- Closed on Tuesdays.

*Rooms begin closing 30 minutes before museum closing time.

**From October to March: access to the permanent collections is free for all visitors on the first Sunday of each month.

PRICES

- Free admission: with no ticket for under-18s, EU residents aged between 18-25, people with disabilities, and recipients of minimum social benefits, on presentation of justification.

Tickets valid only the day of booking.

- Regular Ticket: 15 €, permanent collections, temporary exhibitions and Eugène Delacroix Museum.
- Audio guide: 5 €
- Audio guide reduced price: 3 € for unemployed (with justification)

ENTRANCES

- Pyramid and Galerie du Carrousel entrances: open from 9 am to 7:30 pm on Mondays, Thursdays, Saturdays, Sundays; and from 9 am to 10 pm on Wednesdays and Fridays.
- Passage Richelieu entrance: open everyday (except Tuesday) from 9 am to 5:30 pm (6:30 pm on Wednesdays and Fridays).



Cathédrale Notre-Dame de Paris

6 parvis Notre-Dame - Place Jean-Paul II, 75004 Paris

Notre-Dame de Paris Cathedral, a masterpiece of Gothic architecture, is the most visited monument in France. Located in the historic center of Paris, at the end of the Ile de la Cité, its construction began in the Middle Ages. The many visitors admire the stained glasses and rosettes, the towers, the spire and the gargoyles. They can also discover the treasure of Notre-Dame and try climbing the towers to enjoy a panoramic view of Paris.

OPENING HOURS : Everyday from 8 am to 6:45 pm.

PRICE: Free entrance. 10 € to climb to the top (reservations required).

Musée d'Orsay

The Musée d'Orsay was inaugurated in 1986 in the building that housed the former Gare Ferroviaire (train station) d'Orsay, along the left bank of the Seine. It is one of the largest museums in Europe and has the widest collection of Impressionist and Post-Impressionist paintings in the world, with nearly 1,100 pieces. With more than 3.4 million visitors per year, the Musée d'Orsay is the second most visited museum in Paris.

The Eiffel Tower

5 avenue Anatole France, 75007 Paris

The Eiffel Tower was built by Gustave Eiffel and his collaborators for the Paris Universal Exhibition of 1889, and initially named "tower of 300 meters", this monument became the symbol of the French capital, and a leading tourist site: it is the second most visited French cultural site in 2011, with 7.1 million visitors. Since it was open to the public, it has welcomed more than 300 million visitors.

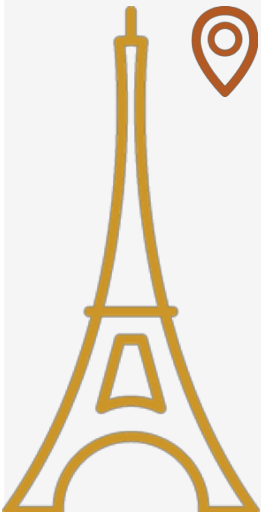


Getting to the Eiffel Tower by metro:

Walk from Apartments du Louvre to the Metro station Louvre-Rivoli. Then, take Line 1 (yellow) direction La Defense and get off at Charles-de-Gaulle Etoile and switch to line 6 (green) following the direction Nation. Either get off at Trocadero where you are on the platform and can take pictures with the Eiffel tower behind you or get off at Bir-Hakeim just by the Eiffel Tower.

Walking to the Eiffel Tower :

If you don't have any problem with walking 50 minutes along the shores of the Seine, this is the most scenic option. You have to take a right when leaving our building and once you reach the river, take another right. Once you get closer to the tower, you cross at Alexandre III bridge.

Le Grand Palais

The Grand Palais was built in Paris for the 1901 World Expo. "Monument dedicated by the Republic to the glory of French Art", it now hosts temporary exhibits events from renowned artists. It plays host every year to the famous Contemporary Art Fair (FIAC), as well as many other events (food fairs, skating rink in the winter, etc.).

CHÂTEAU DE VERSAILLES

Place d'Armes 78000 Versailles

The Palace of Versailles, whose origins date back to the 17th century, was successively a hunting relay, a place of exercise of power and, from the 19th century, a museum. Composed of the Park and gardens and the castles of Trianon, it was the residence of the Kings of France Louis XIV, Louis XV and Louis XVI and covers 800 hectares. Witness of French art in the 17th and 18th centuries, the Château de Versailles and his Estate are listed since 1979 on the list of the world heritage of Unesco and is the most visited castle in France with more than 6 million visitors each year.

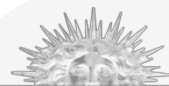

Château de Fontainebleau

77300 Fontainebleau

Located about 60 kilometers south-east of Paris, the Château de Fontainebleau was one of the homes of French aristocrats until Napoleon III. Witness of the different phases of the history of France since the Middle Ages, its first traces date back to the 12th century. Surrounded by a vast park and adjacent to the forest of Fontainebleau, the castle is composed of elements of medieval styles, Renaissance, and classics. In all, the castle, gardens, and forest of Fontainebleau welcome some 13 million visitors a year. In 2017, the National Museum of the Château de Fontainebleau alone attracts 466,193 visitors, making it the 4th cultural and leisure site in the department of Seine-et-Marne, behind Disneyland Paris, the Village Valley and the medieval city of Provins.

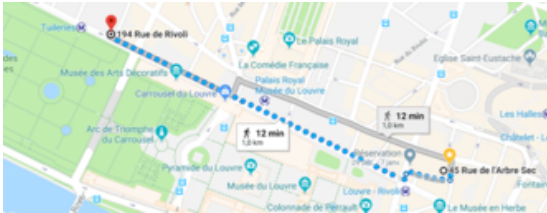
